

Stand-Alone Lead Poisoning Prevention Class for Child Care Providers

Frequently Asked Questions

A new law in Health and Safety Code 1596.866 requires the eight-hour Preventive Health and Safety training to include instruction in lead poisoning prevention for child care licenses issued on or after July 1, 2020. Some providers previously took the eight-hour Preventive Health and Safety training without the lead poisoning prevention content, and are now trying to apply for a license. **Providers in that situation are allowed to take the lead poisoning prevention content as a separate, stand-alone class.**

Who can teach the lead poisoning prevention (LPP) stand-alone class?

Affiliate trainers of EMSA-approved training programs can teach the stand-alone class. They are the same programs approved for the **Preventive Health and Safety Practices (PHSP)** eight-hour training. *All UCSF-CCHP affiliate trainers can teach the LPP stand-alone class.*

How long must the LPP stand-alone class be?

The LPP stand-alone class can be either 30 minutes or 60 minutes long. UCSF-CCHP has created a 30-minute slide show and a five-page LPP booklet for the stand-alone class. Trainers can expand it to 60 minutes by adding ice breakers, hands-on activities, and time for question and discussion.

Should the trainer give students a special LPP stand-alone course completion certificate?

Yes. The trainer should issue a separate course completion certificate or card that states the LPP stand-alone training was completed. The certificate/card should list the EMSA-approved program name, director name, instructor name, student name, and date the course was completed. *UCSF-CCHP has created a sample certificate for trainers to use.*

Does the LPP stand-alone course completion certificate need an EMSA sticker?

No. The course completion certificate/card for the stand-alone LPP class *will not* include an EMSA sticker. The purple PHSP EMSA sticker is *only* provided for the *full eight-hour* Preventive Health and Safety Practices training that *includes* the LPP module.

Should I send EMSA a roster of my students?

Yes. Please complete a class roster of your students for the stand-alone LPP class. Send the roster to EMSA as you would for Preventive Health and Safety Practices training.
