

Supplies and Equipment to Reduce the Risk of COVID-19 in Child Care

Hand Hygiene

- Liquid soap
- Paper towels
- Hand sanitizer
- Disposable gloves

Covering coughs and sneezes

- Tissues

Cleaning and Disinfecting

- Soap and detergents
- Disinfectants (EPA registered)
- Laundry soap
- Extra bedding
- Paper towels
- Spray bottles
- Liquid measuring cup
- Microfiber cloths
- HEPA filter vacuum cleaner
- Dishwasher with a sanitizing cycle
- Garbage can liners

Masks (child and adult sized)

- Cloth face coverings
- Disposable masks

Other Personal Protective Equipment

- Smocks
- Face shields
- Eye protection (goggles)

Physical Distancing

- Carpet squares, mats, hula hoops, pool noodles, or other visuals for spacing children
- Toys that promote individual play and/or can be easily cleaned and disinfected

Daily Health Check/Screening

- Gloves
- Thermometers (touchless, if possible)
- Health screening log

Supplies and Equipment to Reduce the Risk of COVID-19 in Child Care

Drop off and Pick up

- Extra pens that can be disinfected
- Hand sanitizer
- Tape or floor signs to mark off 6 foot distancing

Meals

- Extra tables to promote spacing
- Outdoor furniture for children's meals and staff breaks

Bathrooms

- Toilet paper
- Garbage cans with lids that can be opened by a foot-pedal
- Changing table upgrades and paper rolls

Air Quality/Ventilation

- HVAC system upgrades and filters (start with a consult with a HVAC engineer)
- Portable Air Filtration devices
- Repairs to windows so they can open safely
- Window guards
- Bathroom and kitchen fans that vent to the outdoors

Virtual training and communication

- Tech support
- Computers with audio and video
- Head sets
- Zoom or other virtual meeting platform membership
